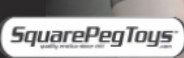

# BENEFICIARIES



**BAYC/Our Space**

**LGBTQ community center**

Our Space is an LGBTQ youth community center that holds the experiences, strengths and needs of systems-involved youth at our core, and recognizes these youth as fierce and fabulous change-agents in our community. Located in Hayward, CA, a program of Bay Area Youth Center/Sunny Hills Services, Our Space serves LGBTQ youth ages 14 - 24, many of whom live in poverty and are impacted by homelessness, the child welfare or juvenile justice systems. Approximately 90 percent of Our Space members are youth of color. They serve over 100 unduplicated youth each year.

In a world where queer and trans youth are stigmatized and marginalized daily, it takes a lot of ferocity to stand up against that hate and choose to love ourselves AND our community unconditionally and for all that we are. At the heart of everything they do at Our Space (and hanging in glitter on our wall), they ask this question: “How do you show fierce love to yourself and your community?” All Our Space services are infused with this concept of fierce love and include:

- LGBTQ community center programming 4 days per week
- LGBTQ youth peer support groups & performance, healing and community-building groups
- A monthly, LGBTQ intergenerational community potluck
- LGBTQ competent and affirming therapy and case management services
- Specialized support services for LGBTQ youth in foster care, and their caregivers and families
- Annual East Bay Youth Pride celebration, organized by LGBTQ youth for LGBTQ youth
- Referrals and linkages to critical support services (i.e. housing, medical, legal, etc.)



The Charlotte Maxwell Complementary Clinic was founded to provide access to alternative complementary modalities of treatment for women with cancer.

**Charlotte Maxwell Complementary Clinic Mission:**

By providing these services we hope to empower women to have control over their lives and health care choices. The clinic was also founded specifically to treat women because of the particular social, economic, and political realities women face in our society and in relation to the health care system.

Through this work we also educate the community at large about cancer and about health care as a human right. CMCC periodically holds informational meetings and workshops for clients, volunteers, and members of the public who work with alternative modalities, conventional cancer treatments, and support services. We also sponsor courses in Traditional Chinese Medicine to train acupuncturists and herbalists in the treatment of women with cancer.

# CONTEST EMCEES:



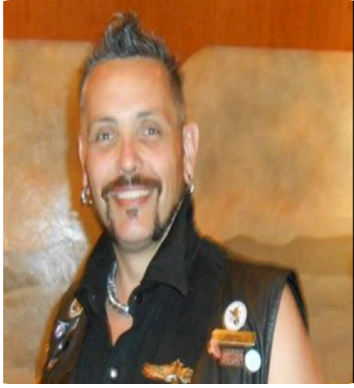

# SILENT AUCTION RULES:

1. Each item offered in the silent auction will have a bid form near the item (each item will be clearly numbered and the item number will be printed on the right hand side of the form).
2. You may bid by simply writing your name on the form next to the amount you want to bid.
3. Please start the bidding at or above the minimum bid amount shown on the bid form.
4. When bidding, please be sure to increase the bid in whole dollars.
5. You may bid on any item in the silent auction until the auction is closed. Bidding for items in the silent auction will close at the time posted.
6. We will announce the winner of each item after the auction closes. Winners who are not present for their items will be contacted by phone.
7. When the auction has closed, please come to the cashier's table at the back of the hall, collect the sheets for the items you won, and pay for the items. You will not be able to collect your items until the auction has closed and you have paid for the items. Payment may be made via cash, check, or electronic.

# JUDGING INFORMATION

## Categories

Interview (100 points possible) - The purpose of this category is for the judges to get to know the contestants. Any question may be posed by the judges; however, the questions should be pertinent to the selection contestants who are knowledgeable about the Leather community, the community in which they live and the lifestyle that they will be representing as titleholders. The interview will also provide the opportunity to see how the contestants manage themselves in what some might consider a stressful situation.

Fantasy (30 points possible) - The fantasy is that portion of the contest where the contestants are provided with an opportunity to display their particular interest in the realm of fetishes or leather. Hopefully, this portion of the contest will be fun for those on stage as well as those in the audience. The fantasy provides the judges with the opportunity to see some of the creativity and organizational ability needed in demonstrating a fantasy. This may suggest the type of leadership skills the contestants have or can promote as titleholders.

Erotic Wear (20 points possible) - This category may be one of the more difficult categories to score. The intent is to allow enough leeway for the contestants to decide what they consider erotic garments and to display that image to the audience and judges. The judges are charged with deciding the number of points scored based on their own reaction to the erotic wear and somewhat to the audience reaction to it, as not all of the judges will find the same things erotic. This category should stimulate a second look at the contestants and suggest sensuality and sexuality. This may be accomplished with full clothing or a minimum of clothing.

Speech (50 points possible) - The titleholders will represent Alameda County Leather Corps frequently at other Leather functions and in other communities. The contestants, it should be noted, are making a 60- to 90-second speech on a topic of their choice. Their choice of a topic as well as their presentation may be considered when scoring.

Leather Image (100 points possible) - This is an overall category that takes a look at the presentation of the contestants to the judges, audience and to those individuals they relate to during the contest. This category is probably best scored last, as it will include the formal and informal observations made by the judges.

# LEE BELL AWARD

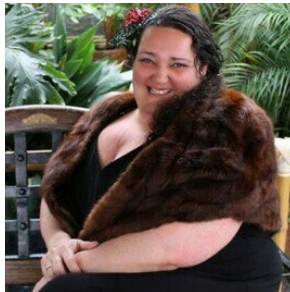

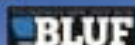
