But seriously, why does all the effort of our club go to making donations? We give money to numerous causes and it's not easy raising funds.

At the recent Board Retreat, we discussed why each of us gives time and work for people we don't know. This year, we gave money to Children's Hospital Oakland to help seriously ill children (in the HIV and infectious disease ward) get care they need. Well, that's all well and good, but none of *my* grandchildren have any serious sickness, so why worry about it?

Sometimes, we're moved to help people who are deaf, hungry, or are suffering from HIV. Again, there's a temptation to say *Well, it's not in* my *family, so why is it something I should work to change?*

As a wonderful mystic once said, "The Force is strong in your family" Which is, of course, from a movie, but still rings true. Many of the spiritual values we hold prompt us to care for others.

In the Pagan tradition, every living thing comes from the Mother of all and therefore is our kin. We also believe that what you put out into the world is what the world gives back to you. Strengthening others, making the world a better place and lessening suffering are things all of us would like to see in this world.

Mr. Allan told me that in the Jewish tradition, performing a selfless act without expectation of recompense is called "making a mitzvah", and it's done to ease suffering in the world, starting with one's own community. (This may be the original version of "Think Globally, Act Locally"!)

The passage from childhood (when one's needs are taken care of by others) to adulthood (when one takes care of the needs of others) is based in this concept.

As folks who practice alternative lifestyles, we often speak of community. Humans are social beings and interacting with others in a context of acceptance and support is critical to our personal well being. One definition of "Community" is "a group of people having cultural, religious, ethnic, or other characteristics in common."

Each of us needs community and when we give back to the community we are strengthening the community and our connection to it through local effort to address local needs.
