Getting to Fun!

In the previous issue of this newsletter, we talked about consent and some examples of what that looked like. Now, we'll talk about negotiation: *Getting to Fun!*

Negotiation can simply be defined as the process of how people plan activities, which also involves deciding about what will and what will not happen during the activity or in the relationship.¹

Depending on the context, negotiations may be brief or long. In our lifestyle and community, with different relationship styles and different types of play, negotiation can even be on-going.

- Perhaps you want to receive or carry out a specific type of play, like fisting or whips (or more!).
- Maybe you'd like to become a Titleholder, or mentor and support Titleholders.
- Or perhaps you'd like to develop your service skills or explore your energy in specific roles with different people.

If you love adventures by helping others, you might be interested in several of these possibilities throughout your journey!

Think of negotiation as talking, opening a discussion, and finding a match between you and someone else in terms of your Leather goals and your Leather interests.

Cut to the scene. Let's say you're walking down the street, and you walk into a bar. You see someone new you've never seen in the bar before, just standin' by the pool table with a cue, and a purple handkerchief in a back pocket. They're rare, fresh meat. You want to have some fun. She wants to have some fun.

This piece of rare, fresh meat tells you that that she read about this thing called the hanky code online, 20 years back in the year 2000. This certainly isn't her first Rumspringa² around; she's one among many who enjoys helping others, and she's also eager to share some other goodies and tips with and for the new kids on the block...check out the Cliff Notes from the Mean Lady below:

It helps to know that the person you are doing negotiation with is trustworthy and will not do anything outside the limits agreed upon when the negotiation was completed.

Here are some sample questions to consider discussing during demonstration negotiation.

- 1. Are you comfortable doing play piercing in public? Have you ever done play piercing before? Have you ever done so in public?
- 2. Communications: What is your safe word? What is your "slow down" word?
- 3. What clothes are you comfortable with being on/off and what position are you comfortable being in during the demonstration? (For example, some want to face the wall and would prefer no clothes be taken off in public.)
- 4. Are any parts of your body off limits during this demonstration?
- 5. What about photos? Are you okay with photos being taken and/or shared, or not?
- 6. What about other people that are interested in participating in the demonstration? Are you okay about other people getting some practice after the demo?
- 7. I am going to pierce this hunk of flesh. I will be talking and answering questions from others; not paying attention to your comfort, between placing needles) are you ok with that in this type of situation?
- 8. What type of aftercare will you need after the demonstration? Can it wait until the class is over?
- 9. Do you have someone that can "spot" you during the demonstration and take care of you after the demo so that the presenter can continue to do the education if needed?

Follow the prescription above and let the thrill ride begin!
