Education: First Aid

Dousing spring showers have turned to golden rays as Pride month has been upon us, and as always, we are out and about! With major upcoming events in our community that will be happening this summer- Up Your Alley, Folsom Street Fair, Leather Realm in San Diego to name a few- we thought that it would be a good time to talk about First Aid. If you choose to engage in play activities, having some basic knowledge about First Aid is necessary and will serve you well throughout your journey.

Only you know where you have been in your journey, and where you are currently, so be willing to consider the health risks that involve yourself and others. Keeping healthy is a required pre-requisite to continue enjoying your journey (in fact, it is a must- as a wise saying goes, "You cannot serve from an empty vessel")². I want to share some information in the First Aid department, and I hope that these tips will serve you well in your play if you choose to engage in play activities (and certainly not limited to being during Up Your Alley, Leather Realm, and Folsom):



- 1. Know your HIV status and your partner(s) HIV status and if you or your partner have any other communicable diseases. Be upfront about your status. If you don't know, ask. Get tested for HIV and sexually transmitted infections before engaging in play.
- 2. Consider what supplies will be necessary for the type of play- i.e. gloves for fisting play; paramedic shears for rope bondage. Trust between you and your partner(s) is still essential.
- 3. Look at the environment to see that all supplies are appropriately present, arranged properly for the situation, and easily accessible- i.e. chucks, gloves, paper towels, corks, rubbing alcohol, sharps container at minimum for piercing
- 4. Have at least a basic knowledge of anatomy and what parts of the body are OK and what parts of the body that are off limits for different types of play; consider whether more training in this area is needed for you if you want to develop advanced play skills (The Anatomy Coloring book however you identify is a great place to start. If you desire more knowledge and have no medical training, find someone in our community who is willing to share some skills and knowledge with you in this area. Your local community college might offer a class in anatomy, too).
- 5. Make a list of your limitations and what you know about your body and how it might react to different types of play so you can share with your partner or be ready to discuss with your partner.

- If you don't know, say that you don't know and tell your partner how you will communicate these limits when playing as you discover them.
- 6. If you are passing by other people playing, look around you and make sure that there is enough distance in between you and them.
- 7. Get formal training in First Aid and CPR.
- 8. Create a self-care toolbox or kit for your own First Aid, however that might look like for you to serve you in what you need to ensure your physical, mental, and emotional well-being. Keep adding to it as you continue in your Leather journey of self-discovery and growth!

Enjoy some fun under the sun! Remember, only *you* can make safe, sane, and fun decisions for yourself.
